2017 STRATEGY REPORT

As many of you know, in 2017 we made public our five-year goals, one-year strategies and the specific tactics we would employ to achieve those strategies. These strategies represent initiatives we at Grace sensed God calling us to above and beyond what we currently do on a weekly and monthly basis. We know all too well that goals are easy to talk about, but often harder to put into action. For that reason, at each congregational meeting we give updates on each tactic labeling them 'done,' in progress' or 'not started.' I am thrilled to report that of the 66 tactics we articulated in January 2017, 62 are completed, two are in progress and two have not been started. I'm unbelievably thankful for the gifted staff team and dozens of faithful members who made this possible.

This year, God has provided abundantly for our financial needs. The offering today takes longer to collect than it used to take to count and record those first years, and for this we are truly grateful.








MEMBERSHIP/ BAPTISM REPORT

As of December 28, Grace Bible Church has 286 members. We've added thirty-five new members in 2017, and thirteen members moved away or joined other churches for a net gain of twenty-five members. We also were able to perform several baptisms over the course of the past year.

304 Heritage Drive

NEIGHBORHOOD PRAYER MEETING REPORT

One of the new ministries added at Grace Bible in 2017 are the neighborhood prayer meetings. These meetings are held once a week in neighborhoods all over Oxford. In these gatherings neighbors meet to read Scripture, sing a hymn, and read a brief prayer. Last year we worked through the Bible readings found in the Book of Common Prayer, known as "Lectionary B." In 2018, we'll begin working through the "Lectionary A" readings. These are simply Bible reading plans first put together by Thomas Cranmer, Archbishop of Canterbury, back in the sixteenth century.

The meetings are designed to be brief, with the content lasting no more than fifteen minutes. That way neighbors can come and go quickly, on their way home from school, work, or the grocery store. However, in many groups attendees linger over snacks or coffee for a few more minutes and devote some extra time to getting to know one another and prayer. Our hope is that this will develop more meaningful friendships and serve as an evangelistic outreach to our neighbors.

These meetings are designed with kids in mind. There is no childcare, but since the meetings are brief and there is no teaching or discussion it's not a problem if children run and play during the meeting. Older kids can participate in the reading and singing and our hope is that they would grow up thinking it normal to go to a neighbor's house and pray each week.

We currently have six neighborhood meetings: two on the west side of town (in Wellsgate and Woodlawn subdivisions), one on the northwest side (meeting in Quail Creek and Twelve Oaks), one on the north side of town, another on the southeast side of town, and a south side meeting. On any given week one hundred people or more are involved.

See the church website, the Grace app, the newsletter, or the Sunday morning worship bulletin each week for the time and place of a prayer meeting closest to you. If there is no meeting near you and you're interested in hosting one, please let J.D. know.

Each Sunday, seeing the smiling children be-bopping down the hallway warms my heart and makes me excited to be exactly where I am at Grace Bible Church. I was blessed to attend ETCH family conference again this year where I was encouraged and challenged in my role. My biggest takeaway from the conference can be summed up with a quote by A.W. Tozer - "Nothing less than a whole Bible can make a whole Christian." Discipling children does not happen apart from the whole Word. It needs to dwell richly in our homes and among those we serve, greatest of those being our children. This is my inspiration for the coming year as I seek to minister to children and volunteers as well as equip parents to shepherd their children.

I have been pleased and motivated by the Sunday school curriculum, The Gospel Project. We are nearing the end of a three year cycle that has taken us through the entire Bible. Each week it highlights the Gospel and brings every lesson back to Jesus Christ. Because of the new schedule, I have had the opportunity to utilize the Gospel Project's suggested large group time to engage a group of students from Pre-K to 6th grade. This has been incredibly fun and energizing to me! Being able to personally engage with the children has changed my perspective as a children's director and given me newfound excitement for my Sunday mornings. Serving little ones and their families is one of the most rewarding tasks I do. It is written in Matthew 19:14, "But Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." I pray this is our church's heart and response to children and family ministry every year!

2017 was an exciting year for the Graceful Women's Ministry (GWM). The GWM leadership team was restructured to have an Executive team consisting of the committee leaders. I am so thankful for each of our volunteer leaders and excited to give you a report on each.

Administration/Finance committee continued to provide administrative support, hold monthly meetings, report to elders, submitted a yearly budget.

Legacy of Grace became the title of our discipleship, mentoring and study of God's Word division of GWM in 2017. We offered three Bible studies, Daily Grace, a Facebook group for women to encourage each other as they read through the entire Bible and GEMS Ministry. Our Single Women's ministry also began a book study based on They Were Single Too: Eight Biblical Role Models by David Hoffeditz.

Events committee kicked off the year by planning events that focused on gatherings for women to authentically connect while deepening their relationships with each other and the Lord. We hosted a monthly Lunch Bunch gathering and five additional events including a women's retreat.

Communications committee has been very diligent this past year to use multiple avenues of communication to encourage women and to connect women including the Graceful Newsletter on a monthly basis. New communication in 2017 included an Instagram account, updated webpage and calendar, adding GWM to text for information in bulletin and a google request form for GWM communication requests.

Outreach was our newest GWM committee. This fall we hosted a Baby Bottle drive for the Pregnancy Center of Oxford resulting in giving the center \$948.00 and a "More than a Meal" evening of service in December.








ALEX COLEMAN REPORT

CHURCH PLANTING

In 2017, Grace Bible Church stepped in to a whole new phase in church planting. We have supported church planters and new churches in the past, but now, we have officially undertaken planting one! Casey and Lauren Russel began sensing a general call to go on the mission field in 2016, but this year that they decided on Las Vegas.

Las Vegas is one of the least churched cities in the nation and has become a focus for various church planting movements. God's work is evident though in the establishment of several strong churches in recent years. We are excited about this work and ask you to pray for the Russells and anyone else who might join them.

GBC has tried to move slowly, carefully and prayerfully with this church plant which will be called Redemption Community Church. The hope and prayer is that God would continue to raise up church planters amongst us, and continue to allow us to support them in prayer, guidance and funding. We want them to have everything they need, humanly speaking, to carry out the task at hand.

So far this year, the team has taken four vision trips to Las Vegas, decided on much of the DNA of the church and has mostly completed an Assessment process by the North American Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention.
